At the time of their development these lessons were evaluated for their conformity with State of Minnesota and National 4th grade science curriculum standards. The four lessons each contain interactive activities for the students and web links to assist teachers' presentations and follow-up discussions. Your students' entries for this contest should be submitted to your public water supply contact for your city or public water supply system. **The top entry from your school will be chosen by the public water supply system, and this entry is due to the MRWA office by February 1, 2018.** The top three posters chosen by MRWA staff from the pool of posters contest entries will be displayed at the MRWA Technical Conference in St. Cloud during the first week in March. Conference attendees will have the opportunity to view and vote for their favorite poster and contest winner!
